Career Connections' purpose was to connect our learners and graduates with employment opportunities, expand and mature iSisters' program offering to meet the needs of our learners and to leverage existing resources to support the transition to work for our learners.

"I have had the pleasure of participating in the iSister's pilot project Career Connections, an especially meaningful venture for students. The iSister's Career Connection program took the students beyond the theoretical learning of computer skills to the practical application of these skills in the Canadian workplace. This comprehensive addition informed students about Resume preparation, Interviewing Skills, Appropriate Dress for the Workplace and Options for Self-Employment. Above all, it gave the students a chance to bond with one another, ask questions, and receive encouragement from staff and teachers as well as receive many suggestions for their job search. Mobile Lab Project has a great Year!

The Mobile Labs were designed by iSisters to teach at-risk youth and disadvantaged women digital media literacy skills. The "mobile" part means that iSisters goes to the students' location and provides the laptops and other required equipment for the labs.

The first Mobile Labs were run in the summer of 2011, and since that time iSisters has delivered 10 full mobile labs to over 40 women. Our partners included Operation Come Home (OCH), Tewegan Transition House and the Nepean Rideau Osgoode Community Resource Centre (NROCRC).
